



Year 7 Catch-Up Premium

Impact 2019-2020

To be presented in the FGB meeting 14.12.2020

The Government has made a commitment to provide additional funding to schools for each year 7 pupil who did not achieve the expected Key Stage 2 standards in reading and/or mathematics. The purpose of this funding is to enable schools to deliver additional support, such as individual tuition or intensive support in small groups or external services, for those pupils that most need it.

It is up to the school to decide the best way to use the funding, using only programmes and approaches that are known to be effective.

Intervention	Impact and outcome at July 2020
Zones of Regulation input to develop emotional regulation skills and positive behaviours for learning	Increase noticed in that pupils are able to attend and concentrate for longer periods of time, understanding how to be in the green learning zone.
Challenge sessions for Red Pathway, especially in reading through lesson study research	Challenge given in red pathway All pupils were on track to achieve their targets. Covid-19 led to no formal assessments happening due to changes in school curriculum and attendance- shielding and home learning packs offered

In 2020-2021 The DfE replaced the Year 7 Catch Up Premium with schools catch up funding as a response to the lack of regular school attendance for many pupils due to the pandemic crisis.
