	<p>JCS Journeys:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Predominantly for pupils within the Engagement Pathway - Travel training and experiences for pupils with complex physical and severe learning disabilities. - Pupil may use a wheelchair to access the community. - Pupils participate in regular journeys within their local community to access community facilities as part of curriculum routines. - Pupils access less-familiar locations using school minibuses. - Pupils gain a number of experiences of using local buses to make local journeys with a high level of support. Pupils may access tube and train journeys as part of curriculum learning. - Pupils learn about travel in the community through their curriculum and Essex council workshops. - Not necessarily an ambition for independent travel. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Curriculum planning to include travel training and weekly access and travel within the immediately local community. - Essex Travel Training to provide bi-annual workshops for Blue Pathway classes. - Essex Travel Training to provide parent workshops for pupils who could potentially participate in simple travel training. - Small group and 1:1 sessions travelling in the community with school staff. -Pupils to bring oyster cards/freedom passes
	<p>JCS Tourers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Predominantly for pupils in the Violet and Purple classes. - Regular travel training experiences through the curriculum including using busses and trains where appropriate. - Shared vision for independent travel expectations discussed in annual reviews and parents meetings. - Involvement of Essex travel training and referrals made to ETT where appropriate. - An expectation for eventual independence with ongoing input from school which is gradually removed. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Curriculum planning to include travel training and regular access and travel within the local community. - Essex Travel Training to provide workshops for pupils in school - Essex Travel Training to provide parent workshops for pupils who could potentially participate in simple travel training. - Small group and 1:1 sessions travelling in the community with school staff. -Pupils to bring oyster cards/freedom passes
	<p>JCS Expeditions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Predominantly for pupils in the Red pathway classes. - Regular travel training experiences through the curriculum including using busses and trains where appropriate. - Shared vision for independent travel expectations discussed in annual reviews and parents meetings. - Involvement of Essex travel training and referrals made to ETT where appropriate. - An expectation for eventual independence with progress made throughout their pathway and particularly in Y11. - School staff to adopt a 'stepped back' approach to support. -Pupils participate in workshops with TFL and ETT focussing on safety and what to do when things go wrong on public transport. - Expectation for independent travel in time for transition to college. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Curriculum planning to include travel training and regular access and travel within the local community. - Essex Travel Training to provide workshops for pupils in school - Essex Travel Training to provide parent workshops for pupils who could potentially participate in simple travel training. - Small group and 1:1 sessions travelling in the community with school staff. -Pupils to bring oyster cards/freedom passes
